On any day **20,000** children who have experienced abuse and neglect need CASA volunteers to speak up in juvenile court for their best interests.

Definition of Best Interests*, Tenn. Code Ann. 36-6-106. Adapted from TN Supreme Court Rule 40.

5,216 children served by **1,568** volunteers who donated
100,678 hours of service.

This is a **24%** increase in new children appointed a CASA volunteer, **9.2%** increase in new volunteers trained and taking juvenile court appointments, and **18%** increase in volunteer hours.

Foster care in Tennessee costs **\$8,800*** per month. Having a CASA volunteer can shorten a child's time in foster care by at least a month. CASA volunteers served **5,216** children and saved Tennessee taxpayers approximately **\$45.9 million** in FY 24.

Budget Request for Recurring Funds

\$160,000 -- \$40,000 for four new counties.

\$27,110 --\$400 for 60 counties and \$3,110 for TN CASA for the sole purpose of funding the shortfall created for Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) programs by the commission's one-percent budget reduction.

The CASA Network would receive approximately \$1,205,000 of the \$25 Million Budget Request for the TN Victim Service Providers Alliance. This represents 17+ local CASA programs and TN CASA to operate at current levels of service.
